HAPPY THANKSGIVING!

Parents, as you are getting this traditional feast prepared, have your kids put together a Thanksgiving Mural. It is easy to do, so much fun, and creates memories for a lifetime!

All you need: Poster board, glue, old magazines, pictures, and something to write and color with.



Directions:

- 1. Talk with your child about the things you're both thankful for. (You may have to explain what "thankful" means to younger children.) Some ideas could include: food, a home, friends, family, teachers or caregivers and school, your neighbors, your faith community, pets, favorite stuffed animals or toys, books and movies, etc. Be sure to include things that your child may not know you are thankful for, such as your education or your health. You can either write these ideas down or just talk about them.
- 2. Look through the magazines and cut out pictures of some of the things you're thankful for. You can also draw or write down your thoughts.
- 3. At the top of the poster board write in colorful letters, "We Are Thankful For..." and explain to your child that you're going to fill in the mural with your ideas.
- 4. Arrange the pictures on the poster board and glue them on. Add drawings and words where needed.
- 5. Decorate your poster board with glitter, fabric, sparkles, etc. Then, hang it up for your friends and family to see!

Dangerous Situation

The sidewalks are wet and many are littered with leaves. That alone makes a slippery situation. But if you have uneven sidewalks, it is downright dangerous! There are some folks who say they can't afford to fix sidewalks. It is a risk. If someone falls and gets hurt, the price will be much higher. The ARC urges you to keep your sidewalks clean at all times, for the safety of others.

Be on alert for Scams..

After talking with the Washington County Sheriffs office, they wanted to spread the news about a couple recent scams in the area.

THE GRANDMA SCAM

Criminals search obituary ads to find vulnerable elders to cheat them out of money. They typically pretend to be a grand child or niece asking for immediate help to either get out of jail, pay rent or will be evicted, or emergency payment of a hospital bill.

Anyone calling to get cash for any reason, even if you think you know them, is cause for hesitation. If you know anyone who may be living alone, please discuss this with them, as they are the most vulnerable. Especially if they just lost a loved one.

NIGERIA—COMPUTER AND BANK

I have recently talked to an elderly person who had someone calling to say they need to get money from them because they have an overdrawn checking account. They are looking for you to send cash to a PO box or get a credit card number. NO BANK will ever ask you for money. If you ever have a concern, drive down to your bank and discuss in person.

Another one reported to me was some type of computer scam. I wish this person could remember the website, but they downloaded something that had a virus and emptied out her checking account. Please be very careful about keeping personal information on your computer if you are connected to the internet. There are malicious programs that can "root" into your computer and upload information, without you even knowing about it.
